Financial Support for Families

The Lakes South Morang College understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

- State Schools Relief (SSR) provides financial support for eligible families to purchase uniform at a reduced rate.
- The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund for eligible students to attend camps, sports and excursions.
- CSEF is available for eligible families (\$150 for primary and \$250 for secondary). Applications forms are available
 at the office for new and/or existing families. Parents who currently receive the CSEF payments and remain
 eligible will automatically have their 2024 application processed by the office.
